# A DICTIONARY OF YORKSHIRE SURNAMES BY GEORGE REDMONDS

From 'Abba', a northern variant of 'Abbey', first recorded in 1570, to Yoward, meaning a 'ewe herd', which first appears in 1379, this comprehensive dictionary of Yorkshire surnames contains thousands of entries, each of which are treated to detailed explanations, not only of their linguistic meaning but also their geographical origin and their changing distribution through time. Each entry cites the sources, and the variant spellings through which many surnames have evolved in the last eight hundred years. The dictionary represents a lifetime of research by its well-known Huddersfield-based author and will be welcomed by all family and local historians, and by those involved in that grand academic endeavour, onomastics, the science of name study.

The book is a substantial 864-page cloth-bound hardback, with a laminated colour dustwrapper. It can be ordered post-free (within the UK) from the publisher, but the sheer size and weight of it means there will be a surcharge for overseas orders: £8 for Europe, £12 for USA or Australia (a contribution to postage, not the full cost).

The contents are: Acknowledgments, vi; Abbreviations, vii–xvii; bibliography, xvii–xviii; Introduction, 1–5; The Dictionary, 6–835; Appendix on 'The most popular surnames in Britain in 1881', 836–841.



Paperback book (233 x 155 mm); 160 pages, with 5 maps and 20 colour pictures on art paper; ISBN 978-1-907730-61-0, £14.95 In medieval times woodland was an important resource for all communities and industries, so it is frequently found mentioned in historical documents such as charters, but often with a vocabulary that is now difficult to understand. This dictionary provides an extremely useful guide to such terms, which will be welcomed by local and landscape historians in both Yorkshire and the country as a whole (most of the terms are not confined to Yorkshire). From acorn and adze to yew and yholster, the dictionary is solidly based on the author's detailed knowledge of the Yorkshire sources, from Anglo-Saxon times to the 1800s. Many of the words have far earlier appearances here than those in the OED. Some of the references are to long-vanished practices such as 'wandhagger'. Three appendices consider the development of woodland vocabulary in more recent times. Extracts from a timber merchant's ledger illustrate the survival of many of the phrases into the late nineteenth century.
